We have had a busy start to the year, in October, we supported the schools Grandparents Tea Party for Harvest.

We are delighted to report that our first BAG2SCHOOL collection of this year weighed a whopping 450kg meaning we received £225. This is AMAZING!! A big thank you to everyone who donated! Look out for the date of our next collection which will be in the Spring.

Thank you to all the families who have supported the school by purchasing Christmas cards and other gifts which feature their child's design. For every purchase we earn 23% commission, this year we have raised almost £200.



His older brother leaned over, nudged him and said, *"Why are you shouting? God isn't deaf!"* to which the little brother replied, *"No, but Grandma is!"*



All parents struggle at one time or another and that is why Home-Start is ready to support families through their toughest times. Home-Start volunteers support families with individual one-to-one home-visiting and work alongside families experiencing challenges such as poor mental or physical health, loneliness and isolation, financial worries, lack of confidence and the feeling of being overwhelmed - just two hours a week can make a big difference to a parent and their children. It's not just drinks that we serve. There's also delicious home-made cakes by a team of certificated bakers or you could have a toasted teacake. So, if you fancy a slice of lemon drizzle, flapjack or some other yummy cake, do come along - you will be most welcome.



There is no charge, however, a donation to a local charity of the month will always be welcome but not essential. In recent months we have donated to the following charities:

Lighting Up the Parish



Once again our bi-annual event was blessed with a window of very decent weather, which enabled everyone to lift their eyes to the heavens, and witness another spectacular firework display, whilst being warmed by the intense heat of a huge bonfire. The torchlit procession from the School was led by the inimitable Great Western Morris Dancers, who entertained the crowd and encouraged a number of the children and adults to take part in a 'mass jig' called Princess Royal before the Procession headed off for the Display at Dulings Farm.

This year our regular Food Tent and Licensed Bar was supplemented by the Farm Shop remaining open, as well as selling locally produced beef burgers on their barbecue. We know that at least 500 people had something to eat that night! We had over 1,700 people come through the gate and we are pleased to announce that we raised a little over £6,300 for the Coppleshone Recreation Association (CRA).

Of course, we cannot now run an event of this size without there being some impact upon local traffic and access, albeit very temporarily. It would defeat the object of it being a local event if we were to try and move the venue out of the village, and most people we talk to far prefer that people just cope with whatever inconvenience and minor disruption occurs, knowing that it is short lived, and the benefits to the community far outweigh any negatives. Having said that, we do continue to learn from each event, how we can improve things for people, so for example, now that we are attracting more people from outside the Village, we need to be arranging for there to be accessible toilet facilities.



We do rely so much upon the good will and practical support from so many people to put on an event like this, so I do wish to thank the following for their time and assistance: Chris Murray and Craig Stanbury for setting up, organising and

running the magnificent fire work display; Roger Pennington and Charles and Hilary Edwards for the use of Dulings and the event field; Lizzie Laessing for use of the Food Tent and Barn, Rose Removals for all the pallets and other bonfire material; and finally to all the Marshalls, Food Tent and Bar Teams for their unstinting work. Looking forward already to 2025!

Sustainable CREDITON



Local events since the summer:

Big Green Fair (Saturday 23rd September). We welcomed old friends as well as new stall-holders including FORE (the Friends of the River Exe), Graham Ley of 'Recyclables' with renovated bikes raising funds for Devon Air Ambulance, and CAG Devon with a recycling game. We were delighted to support the re-launch of the CREDITON Repair Café, and we showcased our own project, #Patchwork CREDITON, as well as the work of the Makers' Boutique, our Community Larder, and the Mossy Carpets Project.

Bug Hotels Giveaway (Saturday 21st October) was a great event: CREDITON is now the richer for an assortment of new bug hotels.

#Patchwork CREDITON – this project has run successfully over a period of weeks, bringing people together to upcycle old textiles into attractive tote bags, re-using fabric to avoid landfill.

CREDITON Repair Café has its second session scheduled for Saturday 25th November, at the Elephant on the Green, just as this paper goes to press. Watch out for forthcoming sessions – normally the fourth Saturday of the month. There will be details in our newsletter and on our Facebook page.

Tree, Woodland and Pollinator: Our Woodland Management Group have met three times so far this Autumn to do coppicing (in return for free firewood); the tree team have held a 'Tree Care Day' to look after trees planted in previous years, and the Pollinator Group have been doing Autumn maintenance on the plots around the town.

Community Allotment and Community Larder: teams have continued work with impressive results. More volunteers are very welcome for either group.

Autumn campaigning:

Representatives of Sustainable CREDITON attended the South-West Unite to Survive climate rally in Bath on 21st September, and reps also attended a meeting with Mel Stride on Friday 10th November to raise climate issues. Sustainable CREDITON is very glad to have incorporated the CREDITON COP26 Group as our Climate Action Team.

Copplestone Gardeners



The Copplestone Gardeners Harvest Special was indeed a special event. On offer for tasting were a myriad of delicious morsels. Blackcurrant curd, gooseberry cake, apple cake and several jams catered for the sweet toothed. Savouries included squash hummus, chutney and confit garlic with a seasoning of Szechuan pepper. A great turn out and some great garden chat as well.

In case you are wondering the Szechuan pepper was grown in a Copplestone garden, it seems unlikely but this shrub thrives here. Szechuan pepper has a citrusy, spicy flavour and an interesting numbing effect on the tongue and lips. It is also said to enhance other flavours and to give you a spiritual lift! The shrub will eventually grow to 7m but is easily pruned to size. It is also prickly, giving it the common name prickly ash. Plants are available online from Otter Farm.

Looking ahead now we are moving in to what is the quietest gardening season. Time to enjoy Christmas and garden at a less frenetic pace.

The garden in winter however, is there to be enjoyed as much as in any other season. Whilst the spring and summer garden is full of activity from growth and flowering the winter garden slows down and offers time to reflect and plan. Many of the larger gardens open to the public now have a specialist winter garden. Rosemoor is perhaps the closest example.

Whilst few of us have the space to create a dedicated winter garden it is possible to inject some winter interest into the smallest garden by plucking one or two ideas from these specialist gardens. The dogwoods often have colourful stems, if planted in front of an evergreen shrub they will light up a dull day and form a winter enhancing vignette to admire from a window. Add some snowdrops and daffodils to extend the interest into the first days of spring.

Whether planting a new Szechuan pepper plant or going out to enjoy a winter garden for inspiration, have a wonderful Christmas and a good New Gardening Year.

Tarka Line News



Following a successful set of submissions by various organisations and individuals including the Tarka Rail Association, the government and train operating companies have withdrawn their proposals to close most of the station booking offices on the English rail network including those at London termini. The consultation with the public was coordinated by Transport Focus. They received 57,825 representations on the GWR proposals. There were concerns over the ability of the following stations to cope with sales demand at high-peak periods: Barnstaple, Bridgewater, Bristol Parkway, Didcot parkway, Maidenhead, Reading, Swindon and Twyford. There were also 257 petitions. The top three themes in responses were concerns over the ability to buy tickets in future (including difficulties in using TVMs), the provision of information needed to plan journeys (including during periods of disruption) and how passengers requiring assistance would receive help and support. The common theme running throughout responses was the role, and value, of staff in delivering all of these.

The Devon and Cornwall Railcard has now become available digitally as well as physical. To purchase the card you will need a valid debit or credit card, proof that you are a permanent resident of Devon or Cornwall, a passport style photo and if buying for someone else the railcard holders details including their email address. It can be purchased at <https://railcards.gwr.com> and offers a 1/3 off your rail fare, 1/3 off for a friend and up to four children can travel for £1 each providing all are travelling together. It costs just £12 and is valid for one year from date of purchase. Purchasing one should be an approximately ten-minute process and allows discounted fares to destinations in Devon and Cornwall.

We have also hosted community wellbeing photo walks at Finch Foundry, Lydford Gorge, Parke and Fingle Woods, welcomes school groups for visits, linked up with DNPA at Parke to learn about the river and make natural boats and visited an area of peatland restoration above Okehampton.

This is one of my favourite times of year when rare sunny days feel like a treat before winter really starts to kick in. We have now moved into winter mode with Lydford Gorge and Finch Foundry closed until next year and the Parke estate and Fingle Bridge woods open all year round for those of you needing fresh air and exercise.

Before we know it, Castle Drogo will be decorated in a traditional style ready for Christmas. We are fortunate to have lots of photos, letters and diaries which tell us how the Drewe family decorated the castle and we try to match their style as much as possible. With the backdrop of the gorgeous architecture, it makes for a little piece of magic. The castle is open every weekend in December but please check the website for full opening times. Lifeline Alarm Service



A Lifeline alarm provides help at the touch of a button 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The service provides peace of mind to people who feel at risk in their own homes. It gives people the freedom to live their life independently knowing that they can obtain assistance when they need it. The technology consists of an alarm unit connected to the telephone line and a button to call for assistance if:

- you have become immobile or incapacitated;
- your security is being threatened or,
- you are suffering from a medical emergency.

The alarm is also supplied with a wireless pendant worn around the neck or wrist allowing help to be summoned from anywhere around your house or garden. Calls for assistance are answered by specially trained staff who will immediately contact family members, friends or neighbours nominated by you for help. In the case of a medical emergency, the appropriate emergency service will also be called.

The Lifeline alarm service is available to everyone in Mid Devon. However, you will need to have a telephone socket with an active landline near a three pin electrical socket. Our prices have recently increased to £47.16 per quarter and a one off installation fee of £40.

ACE Archaeology Club



ACE is going places, well, OK only as far as Dartmoor but now we are beginning a partnership with Dartmoor National Park archaeologists. It has been recognised that we give people a good grounding in excavation when they dig with us at Moistown and DNP need volunteers who have experience for working on DNP projects on the moor. The Park usually is constrained by time and money and would like it if people who volunteer for archaeology projects came ready trained as this saves time. ACE needed more diggers for Moistown and so were happy to take on some of the moor's volunteers to give them a different digging experience.

ACE members worked on test pitting at Lustleigh, looking for flint tools and at Piles Hill stone row looking for dating evidence amongst other things.

Our Moistown dig has been put to bed for another year but we are now doing all the post excavation work. The director has to write up the interim report for this year, which is a major piece of work with lots of technical things to be sorted, drawings to be done, spreadsheets to be filled in. We have spent a couple of days washing finds and still have more to do. We only wash the pottery and glass. Cataloguing and dating come soon but they are just the job for dark winter days.

We did the weekend dig at Coldridge church that was mentioned in our last article, led by our archaeological adviser, and Dartmoor archaeologist, Andy Crabb. We were primarily looking for medieval stained glass and found over 300 small pieces of glass which are now with experts for identification and conservation. We look forward to what they say about it.



At the end of October, Councils at all three levels (County, District and Parish) will have been looking at how much they have spent, how much is left in the kitty and how they can plan the budget for 2024/25. The top tier councils have their council tax capped at 2.99%. As we know inflation is well above that figure and so we can only expect some changes in the services provided. At County level this has already been seen at the proposed disbanding of the mobile library service and I hear that they are also going to reduce the payments to foster carers! The Local Government Association has undertaken some investigations and finds that the County Councils throughout England have the potential of a huge debt! They are encouraging the Government to increase the support they give the Counties; we can only hope that this does not fall on deaf ears!

As we all know roads are a considerable problem in Devon. The people of Copplestone have become totally fed up with the condition of the two A roads that run through the village. Despite what some people think I have been working very hard on this particular project but have come up against the usual wall of budget controls! We have got together a petition which I shall present to full council at its next meeting asking County Highways to prioritise these two key roads for repair.

As a member of the children's scrutiny committee and an ex-teacher I am concerned at the level of education in Devon and in particular the overspend in provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). I have asked the portfolio holder for SEND for a breakdown of the overspend over the past 18 months, it is currently well over £140 million. I have asked for a progression of the overspending and for the plan to not only decrease it but pay it off by March 2026 which is the cut-off point!

Amongst all this doom and gloom there are two areas of encouragement. Figures in from the care sector shows that there has been increasing recruitment, which means that it is becoming easier for the county to find care packages for those people who are either in hospital or in need of care at home. The other piece of good news is for those who travel. The County is retaining the £2 fare for buses until December 2024. I hope that enough people take up the offer to keep some traffic off the roads and encourage this road congestion solution to continue for even longer.

As winter approaches I shall not be out in the cold holding my surgeries.

Recycling Do's and Don'ts



Do you ever wonder if you're recycling right? Here's a quick guide to help you become a recycling pro:

DO recycle. Underlined items should be placed separately in a clear plastic bag:

- Tins, cans, foils and plastics
- Paper, glass and batteries
- Cardboard, cartons, ink cartridges and toners
- Small electricals including mobile phones and vapes
- Clean, dry textiles

DON'T include:

- Food (place in your blue bin)
- Garden waste (place in your brown bin)
- Soft plastics including plastic film and cellophane

By following these guidelines, you're contributing to a more sustainable future. Let's keep our community beautiful and eco-friendly together!

Mid Devon's three-weekly collection scheme, Bin It 123, which was implemented in October 2022, has seen improvements to the district's recycling rates of 9% and a reduction in residual waste of 200 tonnes collected compared to the same period last year. This in turn has led to a reduction in the Council's carbon footprint.

The Council is now advertising vacancies for Recycling Officers in an effort to make further improvements. Officers will join a team with a focus to educate residents on how they can best dispose of their waste and recycling, offering advice through home visits. The Council has also announced that additional side waste will be enforced, and subsequently no longer collected in Mid Devon from 1st October 2023. These changes seek to address areas identified for improvement as the Council aims to achieve a 60% recycling rate by 2025.

- Never hand over personal information or bank details when contacted by phone, email, app, social media or in person.
- If you get sent a link to click to confirm details, don't click it. Go direct through the business if unsure, or if you've been called, dial 159.
- Speak to older or more vulnerable people and share these tips. Younger people are also statistically more likely to be targeted by scammers too.
- Be wary of online shops that you haven't heard of before, or offers on social media sites, particularly if the companies are based abroad.
- Pay by credit card, as you may be able to do a chargeback to retrieve your cash if you think you've been tricked.
- Speed is of the essence. If you have any doubts or suspicions, contact your bank or card provider urgently.

Greetings from Crediton Foodbank. As the winter approaches, we are seeing our number of clients increasing. Many thanks to everyone who donates and keeps our Foodbank going.

Claire is now employed by the Foodbank and is assisting many of our clients to find extra necessary support with their lives. We regularly have Advisors from outside Agencies coming in to give expert advice.

In our first year as a foodbank we handed out over 100 parcels, yet by last year this had increased to over one thousand four hundred. We fed nearly 3,800 people, 45% of which were children, from over 160 households. We handed out enough breakfast cereal to fill 17,000 breakfast bowls, enough tea and coffee to make 100,000 cups and if we stacked all the tins we gave out on top of each other the stack would be taller than 725 double-decker buses. With the average food parcel costing around £40, we hand out over £50,000 worth of food each year, all of which comes in from donations!

Pickled Red Cabbage



This is quick to prepare and makes a tasty addition to Christmas meals.

You need:
Red Cabbage,
Salt,
Vinegar [malt and balsamic],
Brown Sugar,
Bay Leaf,
Peppercorns,
Juniper Berries (if liked)



Remove any blemished leaves from the cabbage, cut into quarters and cut out the tough white core. Shred the cabbage as finely as you can, place in a bowl layering with salt. Cover the bowl and leave overnight. Next day drain the salted cabbage and rinse thoroughly under cold running water. Pack the drained cabbage into sterilised storage jars and cover with a mixture of balsamic and malt vinegar, a teaspoon of brown sugar to each jar, a bay leaf, peppercorns, and juniper berries. Seal the jars.

The cabbage will be ready to eat in about two weeks.

1 litre Apple Juice
Strips of Orange Peel
1 Cinnamon Stick (plus extra to garnish, if you like)
3 Cloves
Sugar or Honey, to taste

Simmer the apple juice with the strips of orange peel, cinnamon stick and cloves for about 5-10 mins until all the flavours have infused. Sweeten to taste. Serve each drink with a little orange peel and a piece of cinnamon stick, if you like.
